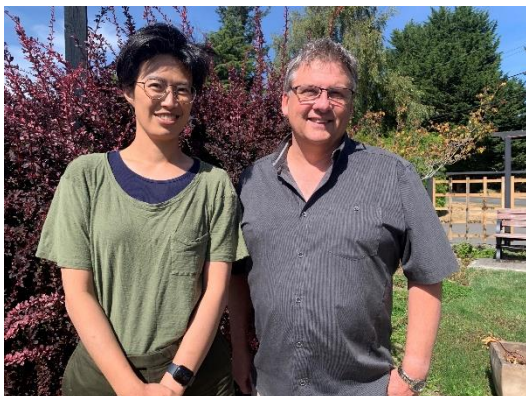

Inter-View: Inter-Spiritual and Queering

Inter-View is envisioned as a safe space for Broad View United's queer and transgender members and allies to connect, learn and support each other. Come as you are, embracing every aspect of your self: faith, spirituality, culture, race, personal journeys (migration, mental health, disability and other topics), and more.

Inter-View offers two main lenses: Inter-Spiritual and Queering. "Inter-spiritual" lets you imbue your Christian faith with wisdom from global cultures and traditions. "Queering" gives freedom to see queer narratives in texts, even the Bible, without heteronormative, transphobic, or harmful biases.

Broad View United has a strong commitment to the ongoing work of Reconciliation as set out in the TRC report and its Calls to Action. Throughout the year, we will be offering opportunities for engagement with local Indigenous leaders and community to learn from them, listen deeply and work at creating new ways of relating to one another. At times those learning events will occur at the church and other times we will venture to other locations that may cause us as settlers to stretch beyond our comfort zones. When working respectfully with Indigenous leaders and Elders, we need to be mindful that western colonial timelines are different for Indigenous folks. The combined Broad View and First Met United Children, Youth, Young Adult and Families program is an exciting, inclusive, creative, and joyful community. Together we explore ways for each of us to learn and to live a hope and faith-filled life.



Sunday Morning Children's Program

Date: Sundays

Welcome to another fun filled year of faith exploration through our children and youth program (ages pre-K to Grade 8) that is offered during each Sunday service. After the children's conversation during the first part of our worship the children move to their own space to explore the sacred stories and the teachings of Jesus. The children are divided up into smaller groups by age and we use art, activity, and games to link our faith to finding our way through everyday life.



Drop In Playgroup

Children under the age of 5 come to play, explore, socialize, learn, laugh and develop. Parents, grandparents, and caregivers interact with their kids in a new setting with lots of toys and lots of room to run and play. This is also an opportunity to connect with other caregivers. There is a short circle time followed by snack. Coffee/tea is also provided for the adults. There is no fee or charge for refreshments. In partnership with Saanich Neighbourhood Place our Parents/Caregivers and Tots Drop In Playgroup will run Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9:30 til 11:00. Monday's drop in will also add a Mother Goose component (an early childhood literacy development program)

HEALTH AND WELLNESS

As part of our amalgamation visioning and ongoing commitment to expanding our community support, we will be offering a wide variety of programs that support the health and wellness of not only members of BVU but the communities in which we live. Support for those coping a variety of health challenges, those needing support and advocacy as they navigate the health care system, and those simply wanting to be proactive about their health and safety will find support at BVU as we move forward. We are still in the process of discernment as to what shape these programs will take, what will be offered when and by who, but these are some of the things we are thinking about.

- **Care for the Caregiver:** Support group for those caring for loved ones whose health status requires constant support and energy. A place to share challenges and joys and gain insights with others travelling a similar path.
- **Mental Health First Aid:** a focused program to enable the average person to know how to support those who find themselves in crisis – either acute or sudden.
- **Naloxone training**
- **Addictions support groups**
- **AED and CPR training**



Gentle Yoga: Mondays and Chair Yoga: Wednesdays

Join us for low-cost Gentle Yoga in the Chapel with teacher Elaine Duke. Beginners are welcome and the cost is \$8-\$10 per class. You will enjoy this gentle practice which improves strength, flexibility, balance and calms the mind. Our teacher is very knowledgeable and can adapt poses for students with limited mobility.

What is the Healing Pathway Ministry?

The Mission of the Healing Pathway Ministry within the United Church of Canada is:

- To renew the Church's role in healing
- To reach out to those in need of healing in body, mind and/or spirit
- To encourage its practitioners in their persona, Spirit-centered healing journey

Healing Sessions

Both distance healing (when recipient not physically present to the healer) and "in-person" healing sessions are offered by the practitioners. Both are equally powerful because the essential transmission of healing energy happens through intention and meditation.

The object is not to try to understand what the passage as a whole is saying but what draws the listener's attention. The passage is read again three times and the members of the group share a feeling or vision that the word they chose invokes. The passage is read again three times and after this set of readings the group shares the invitation that they received for the week invoked by the word they had chosen. The group meets via Zoom on Thursday mornings at 8:30am beginning on Thursday, September 14th and all are welcome to join.
