Minister's Message

Pentecost and Anniversary Celebration

BVU came into being on Pentecost Sunday in 2020. We chose Pentecost as our official starting date because it's a celebration of the church that came into being with the moving of the Spirit (Acts 2). We liked the idea of being attached to this liturgical season both for its meaning and because the date of this is celebrated 50 days after Easter and the date for Easter is fluid, it means that we never celebrate our anniversary Sunday on the same day of the year... it keeps moving and changing. This seems an appropriate metaphor for BVU as we keep moving and changing as well.

This past year folks from First Met joined BVU and so a new iteration of BVU began and we will celebrate this new incarnation on Pentecost Sunday this year which falls on April 19th. There will be wind and fire and surprises to help us

engage in the Pentecost story and we will share communion with one another. The celebration of communion was one of the first shared actions the church undertook as it was being formed.

I think I personally like the celebration of Pentecost the most of all the liturgical seasons. It doesn't have the many theological overlays to it that are as problematic as Christmas and Easter are for me. And the music choices for this day are energetic and multidimensional. And the story has so much going on that it lends itself to having a lot to explore and connecting to as a community of faith. We will unpack this story during the last two Sundays of May. And the other reason I love this celebration as it allows my inner pyromaniac a little room to play 😳

The United Church of Canada is fast approaching its 100th anniversary in 2025 as well. As a church we have navigated a lot of change both within our denomination and as a response to a changing society. We have worked hard to be as responsive to the needs of the Canadian sociological landscape as we could, perhaps not as quickly as needed at times and yet relative to some other institutions, we were more responsive and nibble than others.

My hope for BVU is that we navigate this and the many other anniversaries to come, that we will never stop growing, changing, adapting and being nibble in our responsiveness to the world around us. The pace of change grows ever quicker and our ability to pivot and make changes will continue to be tested. Yet if COVID taught us anything, it was that we have the capacity to make those changes quickly when we make the decision to simply do it. We learned to pivot quickly, and we can transfer those skills to our current context.

Lucky for me, I see all sorts of evidence that BVU continues to do just that. Adapt and pivot quickly. And our move into the building, our recent amalgamation process with First Met and Visioning process and changing landscape for our social enterprises are but a few examples of the resilience and fortitude of this community of faith. Thank you to each of you for your part in these transformations of the Spirit. Happy Pentecost!

AGM Update

On Sunday April 28th BVU held is Annual General Meeting. About 86+ people attended the online meeting. The report was circulated in advance and praise was given for the format and the extensive information contained within about all that had happened this past year. Many shared their appreciation for the format and its tie to the Strategic Plan.

Paul Malnarich and Liane Clark shared some commentary on the financial reports contained within and answered questions from the floor. As well the budget was shared, and a few questions answered as well. The budget for the 2024 year was passed unanimously.

A change to the governance structure of BVU was approved to change the board size from a min of 7 to a max 10 people. A slate of nominees was presented for both those whose terms are being renewed and for new nominations to the board. The new incoming chair Barry Cameron was also elected by the congregation. In addition, 4 trustees were named for the 2024 year: Kathryn Berge, Don Craigmyle, Jan Drent and Forrest Nelson.



The 2023 Annual report will stay on the website for the rest of the 2024 year and folks can access it at any time. The current Strategic Plan is contained in appendix one as well.



Asking questions is important but what seems even more critical at this inflection point is taking the time to be with one another, sharing our stories and listening



Free Workshop: Housing Affordability and "Vacancy Control"

Greater Victoria Acting Together and its member organizations (including Broad View) have identified one of the key measures that will help housing affordability is "vacancy control". This just means that rent increases are limited not only within a single tenancy (as long as the tenant stays in the unit) but ALSO between tenancies (when one tenant leaves and another one takes up the unit). Long-time tenants in older apartment buildings or suites may be paying rents that are far below market rates, giving landlords an incentive to find an excuse for eviction in order to raise the rents. This measure would reduce this incentive and ensure that older housing stock offers lower cost rental opportunities. If there is support, GVAT members will encourage the province to adopt this kind of policy. Petition: Bus Lanes from McKenzie to UVic

Broad View United can support the petition of GVAT member Climate Justice Victoria to have Saanich commit to dedicated bus lanes on 4-lane stretches of McKenzie Ave, to improve the efficiency and speed of transit connections to the university for staff and students. Both the municipality of Saanich and U Vic have committed to reducing emissions through reducing vehicle kilometers travelled in private cars – this is an obvious way to help achieve that. It would also help folks from other parts of town reach BVU via UVic! There is a special spot for organizations such as BVII to sign on and support this measure.

A dozen people join the weekly English Conversation Circle on Zoom regularly. Participants engage one another in honest dialogues, uncovering hidden meanings across




